Dear members and friends of the Husserl Circle,

Just a brief reminder that the 49th Annual Meeting of the Husserl Circle will be held on June 26-29 (Tuesday to Friday), 2018, in Mexico City, under the auspices of the Instituto de Investigaciones Filosóficas (Institute for Philosophical Research) of Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (National Autonomous University of Mexico).

The deadline for submissions, **February 1, 2018**, is rapidly approaching. Your submission, as well as any questions you might have about your trip, should be sent to the email address of the meeting: hcmexico@filosoficas.unam.mx. As we said in our first letter, you can submit either a full paper with a short 150-word abstract or a more substantial abstract (about 500 words) outlining the paper in a clear manner. Decisions will be communicated by March 1, 2017.

Responding to some queries that we have received, we want to make it clear that this will not be a thematic meeting in any sense whatsoever, so papers of any field of research will be welcome. We would be happy if the meeting can be a good representation of the richness and variety of the Husserlian research around the world.

Also, we think it is important to insist that you could let us know at any moment (there is no deadline on this) your willingness to make a comment or reply to some paper in the meeting, instead of presenting a paper. We will try not to duplicate jobs in the meeting, but this will of course will depend on very different circumstances.

The venue selected for the meeting is Casa Universitaria del Libro, an attractive house from the architectural point of view, and with a superb location in the city. In a radius of a few blocks, you can find all kind of hotels, restaurants, bars, coffee shops, boutiques, and other tourist attractions. As the house itself, Colonia Roma, the neighborhood where the house is located, is a magnificent example of the French architecture promoted in the city during the years of the presidency/dictatorship of Porfirio Díaz (1876-1911), and a little while thereafter. And Colonia Juárez, the adjacent neighborhood, is the tourist heart of the city.

In the following days we will complete the information on the website of the meeting (www.filosoficas.unam.mx/hcmexico) regarding our suggestions for hotels and places to eat while at the meeting, all nearby the Casa Universitaria del Libro. If you want other kind of recommendations about, for instance, tourist landmarks in the city, first rate restaurants, the city transportation system, or any other question concerning your visit, please ask us directly through the same email address. We will also have in the website some information about emergency telephones and other practical stuff.

We look forward to welcoming you in Mexico City next June!
